THE TOWN PLAT.

The town of St. Cloud is laid out on the south shore of Lake East Tohopekaliga, with the avenues—named after the States—running due north and south, and the streets, numbered from the lake shore, running due east and west. A wide boulevard or park intervenes between the town and the lake. Each of the squares inclosed by the streets and avenues is divided into 24 lots, each 25 feet front by 150 deep, and numbered consecutively from the northeast corner.

The railroad runs thru the town from west to east, with about one-third of the town on the north side and the remainder on the south. Below is a diminished reproduction of the town plat:
